After leaving our mountain "home" in Enderby, we headed to our final stop - Bowser, BC. We were delighted to find it to be a picturesque and quiet but friendly seaside community.




Best of all, Bowser is located right on the east coast, directly across from two smaller islands, Denman and Hornby. We were thrilled to have such a great access point for using our kayaks! The small island with the white buildings is Chrome Island, the site of a light station and an archaeological findings including petroglyphs. We were impressed that on one of our first trips we made it all the way to Tribune Bay Beach on Hornby Island, a very popular spot for visitors travelling by boat.

It did not take us long to find out that harbour seals are abundant here – we encountered them on virtually every outing we made. We also saw dolphins on one of our trips!



Deer are also very common on the Islands. These three beauties were often seen in our neighbourhood, sometimes enjoying an apple off of our hosts' tree.



This area is well known for oyster farming – just down the road from us was a UBC research facility that helps support the industry (shown on this year's Amazing Race Canada). With changes in the ocean, there have been a lot of challenges lately for oyster, clam, and scallop farming, as well as for fishing.



Of course we sampled some seafood – possibly the scallops were our favourite.



We were amazed to see how plentiful the wild blackberries were. Anywhere we went, we didn't have to look far to find a fruity snack...



...or a sweet snack (the Custard slice was twice what is shown in the picture). By the end of our trip, mushroom foraging season was well underway.



With Bowser as a base, we were able to take many interesting day trips by bike, car, or kayak. Nearby Parksville is known for its beach and for its annual sand sculpture contest.


Port Alberni, British Columbia



We enjoyed Denman Island by kayak and by bike. Morning Beach is a lovely peaceful spot. But you have to get there in the morning or the sun will be gone!




One of the plane's stops was at Refuge Cove, on West Redonda Island.
